

SCOPE OF PRACTICE

Section 301 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services to help clients relax in order to:

- a. Reduce their stress and accompanying tightness or tension in feet, legs, hands, arms, shoulders, neck, torso, face and jaws; and
- b. Reduce any accompanying irritability, fear, worry or concern; and
- c. If any client has any concerns that his or her stress is a medical, dental, psychological or chiropractic problem, the Licensed Neurotherapist shall referral the client to a licensed professional in the appropriate profession; and
- d. If working on an animal and any client has any concerns that her or his animal may have a condition, disease or disorder, the Licensed Neurotherapist shall refer the client a licensed veterinarian; and
- e. The Licensed Neurotherapist may work under the supervision of any such licensed professionals in lieu of making such referral.

Section 302 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services to help clients re-educate their muscles in order to:

- a. Reduce the pain in their feet, legs, hands, arms, shoulders, neck, torso, head, face and jaws; and
- b. Reduce any accompanying irritability, fear, worry or concern; and
- c. If any client has any concerns that his or her pain is a medical, dental, psychological or chiropractic problem, the Licensed Neurotherapist shall refer the client to a licensed professional in the appropriate profession; and
- d. If working on an animal and any client has any concerns that the animal may have a condition, disease or disorder, the Licensed Neurotherapist shall refer the client to a licensed veterinarian; and
- e. The Licensed Neurotherapist may work under the supervision of any such licensed professionals in lieu of making such referral.

Section 303 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for any clients who have a medical condition, disease or disorder if:

- a. The client is under medical care with a licensed medical professional; and
- b. The Licensed Neurotherapist is helping the client reduce the stress or pain pain accompanying any medical condition, disease or disorder; and/or
- c. The Licensed Neurotherapist is providing neurotherapy services under the supervision of a licensed medical professional.

Section 304 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for any clients who have a dental condition, disease or disorder if:

- a. The client is under medical care with a licensed dental professional; and
- b. The Licensed Neurotherapist is helping the client reduce the stress or pain accompanying any dental condition, disease or disorder; and/or
- c. The Licensed Neurotherapist is providing neurotherapy services under the supervision of a licensed dental professional.

Section 305 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for clients who have a psychological condition, disease or disorder if:

- a. The client is under medical care with a licensed psychotherapist; and
- b. The Licensed Neurotherapist is helping the client reduce the stress or pain accompanying any psychological condition, disease or disorder; and/or
- c. The Licensed Neurotherapist is providing neurotherapy services under the supervision of a licensed mental health counselor or psychotherapist.

Section 306 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for clients who have a chiropractic condition, disease or disorder if:

- a. The client is under medical care with a licensed chiropractor; and
- b. The Licensed Neurotherapist is helping the client reduce the stress or pain accompanying any chiropractic condition, disease or disorder; and/or
- c. The Licensed Neurotherapist is providing neurotherapy services under the supervision of a licensed chiropractor.

Section 307 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for clients whose animal has a veterinary medical condition, disease or disorder if:

- a. The client's animal is under medical care with a licensed veterinarian; and
- b. The Licensed Neurotherapist is helping the animal reduce its stress or pain accompanying any veterinary condition, disease or disorder; and/or
- c. The Licensed Neurotherapist is providing neurotherapy services under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian.

Section 308 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for clients suffering from minor or irritating physical ailments, aches and pains:

- a. The Licensed Neurotherapist may help clients address addictions, allergies, blood pressure, chronic fatigue, chronic or intermittent pain, closed head injuries, digestive problems, dizziness, headache pain, heart rate, heart rate variability, hyperactivity,

hypertension, migraine activity, palsy, pre-menstrual stress, post trauma stress, reaction times, restless leg, sleep problems, spasms, stroke damage, tics or vertigo; and

b. With evidence of advanced neurotherapy training with an accredited education organization in any of these experimental areas, may assist clients in resolving autoimmune dysfunctions, coma, eating disorders, Parkinson's disease, sleep disorders, Tourette's syndrome and traumatic brain injury; and

c. The Licensed Neurotherapist will monitor these clients closely and if no improvement is obtained within six sessions, or if the condition worsens, will refer the client to a licensed medical practitioner.

Section 309 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for clients suffering from any minor or irritating emotional problems or issues:

a. The Licensed Neurotherapist may help clients address addictions, anxiety, attention deficit, conduct disorders, depression, grief, inner tension, learning disabilities, panic attacks, performance anxiety, post-trauma stress, rage, sleep disorders and stress-related emotional issues; and

b. With evidence of advanced neurotherapy training with an accredited education organization in any of these experimental areas, may assist clients in resolving attachment disorders, borderline personality disorders, dissociative identity disorders and obsessive-compulsive disorders; and

c. The Licensed Neurotherapist will monitor these clients closely and if no improvement is obtained within six sessions, or if the condition worsens, will refer the client to a licensed mental health counselor or psychotherapist.

Section 310 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for clients suffering from any minor or irritating mental problems or issues:

a. The Licensed Neurotherapist may help clients address attention, cognitive decline, concentration, focus, short or long term memory loss, learning problems, mental dexterity and the lack of feelings of well being.; and

b. The Licensed Neurotherapist will monitor these clients closely and if no improvement is obtained within six sessions, or if the condition worsens, will refer the client to a licensed medical practitioner, mental health counselor or psychotherapist.

Section 311 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for clients suffering from any minor or irritating dental problems or issues:

a. The Licensed Neurotherapist may help clients address clenching of teeth, jaw and/or neck tension; and

b. The Licensed Neurotherapist will monitor these clients closely and if no improvement is obtained within six sessions, or if the condition worsens, will refer the client to a licensed dentist.

Section 312 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for clients suffering from pain:

- a. The Licensed Neurotherapist may help clients address chronic, intermittent or nagging pain problems; and
- b. The Licensed Neurotherapist will monitor these clients closely and if no improvement is obtained within six sessions, or if the condition worsens, will refer the client to a licensed chiropractor or medical practitioner.

Section 313 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide neurotherapy services for animals suffering from any minor or irritating problems or issues:

- a. The Licensed Neurotherapist may help animals by addressing issues of concern to their owners; and
- b. The Licensed Neurotherapist will monitor the progress of these animals closely and if no improvement is obtained within six sessions, or if the condition worsens, will refer the client's animal to a licensed veterinarian.

Section 314 - Licensed Neurotherapists must refer their clients to a licensed medical practitioner any time:

- a. The client complains of a medical condition, disease or disorder not currently being treated by a licensed medical practitioner; or
- b. The client reports, or the therapist suspects, there may be a medical condition, disease or disorder and the client does not show any improvement after six neurotherapy sessions; or
- c. The client's condition worsens.

Section 315 - Licensed Neurotherapists must refer their clients to a licensed mental health counselor, psychotherapist or medical practitioner any time:

- a. The client complains of a psychological condition, disease or disorder not currently being treated by a licensed psychotherapist; or
- b. The client reports, or the therapist suspects, there may be a psychological condition, disease or disorder and the client does not show any improvement after six neurotherapy sessions; or
- c. The client's condition worsens.

Section 316 - Licensed Neurotherapists must refer their clients to a licensed chiropractor any time:

- a. The client complains of a chiropractic disorder not currently being treated by a licensed chiropractor; or

- b. The client reports, or the therapist suspects, there may be a chiropractic disorder and the client does not show any improvement after six neurotherapy sessions; or
- c. The client's condition worsens.

Section 317 - Licensed Neurotherapists must refer their clients to a licensed dentist any time:

- a. The client complains of a dental condition, disease or disorder not currently being treated by a licensed dentist; or
- b. The client reports, or the therapist suspects, there may be a dental condition, disease or disorder and the client does not show any improvement after six neurotherapy sessions; or
- c. The client's condition worsens.

Section 318 - Licensed Neurotherapists must refer their client's animals to a licensed veterinarian any time:

- a. The client complains of their animal suffering from a veterinary condition, disease or disorder not currently being treated by a licensed veterinarian; or
- b. The client reports, or the therapist suspects, there may be a veterinary condition, disease or disorder and the client's animal does not show any improvement after six neurotherapy sessions; or
- c. The client's animal appears to worsen.

Section 319 - Licensed Neurotherapists may continue to provide neurotherapy services after a referral is made:

- a. by working under the supervision of the licensed professional caring for the client because the referral was made; or
- b. by working with the express permission of the licensed professional caring for the client.

Section 320 - Nothing in these regulations shall be construed to allow any Licensed Neurotherapist to:

- a. Practice medicine without a license; and
- b. Practice dentistry without a license, and
- c. Practice psychotherapy without a license; and
- d. Practice mental health counseling without a license; and
- e. Practice chiropractic without a license; and
- f. Practice veterinary medicine without a license; and

g. Practice naturopathy, homeopathy, nutrition or hypnotism without a license.

Section 321 - Nothing in these regulations shall be construed to prohibit any Licensed Neurotherapist from:

a. Practicing any other health care profession for which the therapist is qualified by education or training, except those professions expressly prohibited in Section 320; and

b. Practice any other honorable and law-abiding profession not related to any profession expressly prohibited in Section 320 herein.

Section 322 - Licensed Neurotherapists may provide biofeedback services to their clients under their neurotherapy license:

a. Providing biofeedback services must be done in accordance with the regulations governing the scope of practice for Licensed Biofeedback Therapists as set forth in the biofeedback regulations; and

b. Providing biofeedback services is allowed under the license for a Licensed Neurotherapist and a separate license for biofeedback is not required.
